Yearlong Curriculum:

English Language Arts

Reading

With a focus on "just right" books, reading strategies, comprehension and response to literature

- Reader's Workshop - independent reading time
- Guided Reading Groups – small group instruction
- Shared Reading – whole group reading of big books and poetry
- Read Alouds
- Reading Discovery and Small Group Instruction

Writing

- Writer's Workshop – independent writing time focusing on personal narratives, informational & procedural writing, persuasive writing and response to literature


Special Curriculum

- PE with Ms. Kathy Jones or Music with Dr. Kara D'Ambrosio
40 minutes /2-3 times a week

Lighty's Class PE Days– Monday & Thursday
McAdams' Class PE Days – Tuesday & Friday
(Wednesdays are alternating)

- Art with Ms. Bev Iverson – 40 minutes every Tuesday
- Library – 40 minutes every Wednesday with Mrs. Sharon LaCrosse. Library books should be returned by Tuesday. 1st graders are allowed to check out 3 books.
- Technology – 40 minutes a week on the computer lab.
- Reading Discovery with Mrs. Suzanne Drysdale– One on one instruction, 30 minutes daily for select students
- Early Literacy Small Group Instruction with Mrs. Suzanne Drysdale – Small group instruction, 30 minutes daily
- Big Buddies – meet every other week with 4th grade students to share reading, art projects, and other activities.
- Field Trips – Hiller Aviation Museum, San Francisco Zoo, Community Walk, and CuriOdyssey

First Grade Homework



We consider homework an important part of the first grade curriculum. Your first grader will bring home a homework envelope every **MONDAY**. The envelope is to be returned on **THURSDAY**. The first grade team selects homework assignments that are developmentally appropriate. Homework is your child's responsibility and should be done *in pencil* by the child. We encourage parental involvement in providing assistance when needed. Check your child's homework to make sure it is completed and placed in the homework envelope and returned on **THURSDAY**. More information will be sent home in January when homework will begin.

Snack and Track



Snack and Track is a daily activity that allows each child to take a break and exercise prior to the next set of lessons. During this time, students complete a few laps around the K field and get a snack prior to returning to class. Parents are asked to provide a small serving of fruits and/or vegetables for your child's class based on a weekly sign-up online. We have students with severe nut and seed allergies. You can drop snack off in the morning in the classroom each day or for the whole week.

Allergies

Please be aware and considerate of students who have allergies. Talk to your classroom teacher about specific allergies, questions, and concerns.

Please remind your child why we do not share snacks in first grade. Children often do not know the ingredients in foods and may eat something they are allergic to.

Birthdays



Birthdays are a very special time in a child's life. It is a time to be shared with friends and classmates. We in first grade want to make each student's birthday a special time. We hope to do so with your support and cooperation. You may bring a simple treat (fruits

and/or vegetables) for your child's class that will be passed out during the day. Please keep in mind that treats are optional.

In first grade we celebrate Halloween, Thanksgiving, Winter Celebration, Valentine's Day, the 100th Day of School, Chinese New Year and St. Patrick's Day.

Star Student

Starting in January, each week, a student will be selected to be the *Star Student*. When your child is selected, a questionnaire will be sent home. Please help your child complete the form and have him/her return it to class the following week. Along with the questionnaire, your child will be bringing home a piece of poster board on which he/she can glue pictures of family, pets, favorite activities, special interests, etc. The *Star Student* will have an opportunity to share this poster during his/her special week along with a special item of their choice to share with the class. This poster does not have to be elaborate, just something that reflects his/her individuality and uniqueness!
