 - Approx 22+ pages
- **★** THINKING
 - Awareness, Comprehension
- **★** WRITING
 - Analysis, Application

- ★ FAST & FURIOUS
 - o Collect, Draft
- ★ REVISION & EDITING
 - Conferring, Partnerships
- ★ GOALS
 - Rubrics, Track progress/growth

For the most part, all of this work takes place in the classroom.

Language Arts

Goal: To improve the students' reading and writing skills while preparing students for middle school language arts.

- Word Study Vocabulary
 - Prefixes, Suffixes, Greek and Latin root words
 - Study skills, 5-10 minutes every night, plus additional homework
 - Quiz after every unit
- Daily Language Review and Sentence Study
 - Grammar practice
- Spelling
 - 5th grade word lists (academic words, sight words, etc.)
 - Quizzes
