In social studies, we are learning about winter holidays around the world. Through literature, we are comparing/contrasting how different people bring light into the darkest time of the year through celebration and giving to others.

In science, we are investigating the winter season, ice and water. We will review the water cycle and how weather changes happen. We will be making snowflakes, ornaments, pattern chains and many decorations for you to enjoy!

Our SEL lessons this month are focused on helping others, giving to others, and awareness of others' feelings. These amazing students are using their SEL tools daily and it has been a pleasure to observe their development as a class.

## TK in the Design Lab

Last month, TK was able to spend time exploring in the Design Lab. We primarily used Rig-A-Majigs (https://rigamajig.com/) to design and build large creations to share as a class. I observed many innovations from new machinery, vehicles and imaginary animals. We learned how to imagine, sketch, build and share our ideas. Students were then given the challenge of designing a toy animal by using the design process. After sketching, building, sharing ideas and fine-tuning, they were able to watch as their creations came to life in the laser cutter. They assembled and decorated to finish it off.
