

TK Newsletter October 2017 What's happening this month?

Social-Emotional Learning (SEL):

We have been focusing on friendship, listening skills, respecting personal space and conflict resolution. We are learning about listening to others and responding appropriately to their words. We are working on using "I feel ____ when ____ " messages with each other at school. These are great skills to practice at home as well. This month, we are creating a feelings book and learning about labeling our emotions when we are upset.

Science: Oceans! We are immersed in learning about ocean plants and animals, the different ocean habitats around the world, food chains, the properties of water, adaptations and more! We are learning about non-fiction text, labeling diagrams and classifying groups of animals. This theme offers many scientific explorations and is loved by all.

Math: Over the past few week students have been focusing on recognizing different shapes: rhombus, hexagon, octagon, triangle, square, circle rectangle and more! We are learning about the attributes of different shapes and how to sort and label them. Number sense and counting are continued studies in TK. Practicing counting out loud up to 20 and also counting objects with one-to-one matching are great skills to practice at home. Count toys, beans, cereal, or anything that holds your child's interest. We have also been focused and counting on our fingers up to 10 and backwards to zero.

Literacy: Students have been practicing recognizing letters, the letter sounds and writing the letters with a variety of mediums. Rhyming words, reciting nursery rhymes, and reading predictable text are daily practices in TK.

Writing first names is an important skill that we practice a lot at school. I encourage everyone to practice this at home as well (using lowercase letters) in many fun ways: sidewalk chalk, writing in mud, cornmeal, sand, white boards, anything big, fun and often! Once they have mastered their first name, you should begin to practice last names and names of family members.
