Meghan Clark Beth Nash

Meghan describes Ravenswood Project. Her experience about the large contrast between Ravenswood District vs. WES.

A group of WES parents are working to support the district.

Ravenswood District K-8: 2,500 students, 89% low income, compared to 7% in surrounding area. 44% homeless and/or home insecure (sleeping on couches). 76% students not reading at grade level. This affects all their classes, since they can't read in the other disciplines, either.

Ravenswood Action Team (RAT) - Adopt a Teacher in the District: volunteering in classrooms/library, donating money, table at Ravenswood Auction, Teacher Appreciation luncheon, money for field trips, art supplies.

If you have any thoughts for improvement, please email Tim, Beth P., or Steve.

- 1. Open lines of communication early there's built-in anxiety on both ends of the relationship, especially early in the school year.
- 2. Treat each other respect. Always go to Teacher 1st for solving problems.
- 3. Remember Teacher is responsible for the whole classroom, not just individual kids.
- 4. Praise and Appreciation always good to do.
- 5. Start by inquiring, not accusing.
- 6. Avoid becoming defensive in the face of criticism.
- 7. Teach kids to advocate for themselves.
- 8. Don't try to resolve major issues by email. Make an appointment with teacher rather than try to discuss at drop-off or pick-up. Back to School Night is a good place for Teachers to communicate how they'd prefer to be contacted.

Main takeaways:

Teachers are here because they love their work and your children.

They share your goals: your child's success.

Reach out.

Respectful communications/solutions with parents/children/teachers.

Teachers have the whole class in mind.

Beth P.: Please don't wait if you have an issue. The sooner you tackle the problem, the easier it is to deal with. The longer there's a delay, the more awkward or difficult it becomes to deal with.
