(L) **Cam Jansen and the Mystery of the Stolen Diamonds** by, David Adler: When "Cam" Jansen and her friend Eric are at the mall, they witness a robbery at the jewelry store! Can Cam's amazing photographic memory help catch a thief?

(L) **Stink the Incredibly Shrinking Kid** by, Megan McDonald: The story revolves around Stink, a second-grader who suddenly starts shrinking.

(L) **Horrible Harry in Room 2B** by, Suzy Kline: Doug discovers that though being Harry's best friend in Miss Mackle's second grade class isn't always easy, as Harry likes to do horrible things, it is often a lot of fun.

(N) **Piper Green and the Fairy Tree** by, Ellen Potter: There are three things you should know about Piper Green: 1) She always says what's on her mind (even when she probably shouldn't). 2) She rides a lobster boat to school. 3) There is a Fairy Tree in her front yard.

(N) **My Heart is Laughing** by, Rose Lagercrantz: Dani's been trying her best to stay happy ever since her best friend Ella moved away. But when some girls in Dani's class start being cruel to her, it starts a chain of rather unhappy events ... It would all be okay if only Ella would move back.

(O) **Tornado** by, Betsy Byars: As they wait out a tornado in their cellar, a family listens to their farmhand tell stories about the dog that was blown into his life by tornado when he was a boy.

(O) **Calvin Coconut: Hero of Hawaii** by, Graham Salisbury: When a hurricane causes the river near his Hawaiian home to flood, Calvin Coconut makes a daring rescue. Read more Calvin stories!

(P) **A Lion to Guard Us** by, Robert Clyde Bulla: Amanda's father left Ireland years ago for America. But now that her mother has died, Amanda decides to take her brother and sister to America to find their father.

(P) **All Stations! Distress! April 15, 1912, the Day the Titanic Sank** by, Don Brown: The captivating story of this amazing vessel, the people who built it, and its tragic demise during its maiden voyage across the Atlantic.
