Mandarin



Course Description

- Balanced curriculum: development of four skills in Mandarin —listening, speaking, reading, and writing (typing), as well as cultural understanding.
- Student-centered learning environments
 - Learning activities that match students' proficiency level in Mandarin.
 - Teach learning strategies and skills.
 - Use authentic materials: songs, video clips, news and etc.
 - Use technology and educational applications: Kahoot, book creator, iChinesereader, quizlet, Edpuzzle, Google classroom, etc.
 - Apply teaching methods that invite students taking the lead in learning and promote passive learning.
 - Prepare students for their high school study.

Physical Education

Mission: To provide students with the skills, knowledge, and attitude needed to lead physically active lifestyles lives both today and in the future

- CA Physical Education Framework Standards (2007)
- Students have a wide variety of activities including dance, tumbling, cooperative, and competitive games.
- PE class alternates with music every other day.
- SEL A safe and positive learning environment. Students learn to build relationships by working together both cooperatively and competitive activities.
- Physical fitness is emphasized and measured using FITNESSGRAM (a state adopted physical education program that helps students focus on personal improvement). Students learn to set goals and monitor progress.
- Middle school students have additional opportunities for physical activity classes such as courses in Physical Fitness or electives such as Self Defense, Yoga, Wrestling, and Strength and Conditioning.

- 7th Grade: Pattern study from Islamic art and West African masks





Course Highlights:

- 8th Grade Design Exit Project: take on year-long project that incorporate multiple disciplines.

- 6th and 7th Grade: Immersed in Engineering/Design process in academic classes, as well as the option to attend Design electives
- 8th-grade projects are student-driven based on their interests and passions
- Students may use the following technologies in their projects: Fusion 360, Arduino/Raspberry Pi, HTML/CSS, Adobe Creative Suite, SketchUp, iMovie, Final Cut Pro, and InVision.
